178 Curriculum for the bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies (2022 version)

English translation: Chinese Studies

At its meeting on 5 May 2022, the Senate approved the Curriculum for the bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies specified below, which was adopted on 25 April 2022 by the Curriculum Committee, a body holding decision-making powers, and established in accordance with section 25, para. 8, no. 3 and para. 1, no. 10a of the 2002 Universities Act.

The legal basis is the 2002 Universities Act and the section governing university studies of the Statutes of the University of Vienna as amended from time to time.

§ 1 Objectives and qualification profile

(1) The bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies at the University of Vienna aims to teach a basic knowledge of modern standard Chinese language, to introduce students to central questions, theories and methods of the social science and cultural studies aspects of Chinese Studies.

(2) Graduates of the bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies at the University of Vienna have linguistic competence for communicating in modern standard Chinese in everyday situations and in selected specialist fields. They can critically reflect on societal, political and cultural developments in China and acquire basic knowledge enabling them to contextualise and interpret current events in Chinese-speaking societies. They are qualified to identify academic research questions relevant to Chinese Studies and to address these with adequate materials and recognised methods from the social sciences and cultural studies. They thereby acquire competence and skills qualifying them for further studies. The graduates have skills, allowing them to pursue a career in various areas requiring specialised knowledge of modern Chinese-speaking societies in the context of worldwide modernisation and globalisation processes.

§ 2 Duration and scope

(1) The bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies comprises 180 ECTS credits. This is equivalent to a degree programme duration of six semesters.

(2) The programme is deemed completed if 150 ECTS credits as defined in the provisions on compulsory modules have been obtained and extension curricula comprising 30 ECTS credits have been completed. Alternatively, students can complete an extension curriculum comprising 15 ECTS credits in combination with the elective module on International Chinese Studies and/or alternative extensions comprising 15 ECTS credits.

§ 3 Entry requirements

Students are admitted to the bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies in accordance with the 2002 Universities Act and the 1998 university eligibility regulation (*Universitätsberechtungsverordnung*) as amended.

§ 4 Academic degree

Graduates of the bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies are awarded the degree "*Bachelor of Arts*", abbreviated as *BA*. If the title is carried, it must be placed after the graduate's name.

Module aims	Students are introduced to modern Chinese. Upon completion of this module, they will have acquired basic knowledge of spoken and written Chinese. In addition, students are able to actively and passively use vocabulary taught in characters and the Hanyu Pinyin romanisation system and to form simple sentences.

M02	Module: STEOP: Introduction to Chinese Cultural History (compulsory module)	4 ECTS credits
Prerequisites	None.	

Module aims	This module introduces students to China's modern and contemporary history from a cultural perspective. The module addresses intellectual movements, as well as literary and cultural developments in China since the late Chinese Empire. Students are familiarised with the most important cultural events, persons and cultural phenomena which transformed Chinese society during the transition from the pre-modern to the modern era. Students are able to identify cultural continuity and change over different periods, ideologies and political systems until the 21st century. Moreover, they learn about the influence of foreign cultures on the development of modern China. They acquire knowledge of the culture and history of the Chinese Empire to understand their importance, influence and relevance for contemporary Chinese culture. Upon completion of this module, students understand culture as an important element of the historical development towards nation building of modern China and the rise of China as a global power.

Module aims	This module introduces students to modern and contemporary history of China from a political perspective. Students are familiarised with the most important Chinese political events focussing on the domestic developments in the Republic of China and the People's Republic of China. Students learn about political systems, institutions and political change in different eras and acquire an understanding of the role of politics in social and economic change. They are familiarised with political systems, important actors, political movements, ideologies, policies and basic concepts of Chinese political philosophy. Upon completion of the module, students understand strategies and policies aimed at establishing and maintaining territorial control, improving governance, creating legitimacy, maintaining stability and coping with national, regional and international crises.

Module aims	In this module, students learn about the characteristics of spoken Chinese through practical exercises. Upon completion of this module, students can actively and passively differentiate between all speech syllables. Furthermore, they are able to engage in simple conversations.

They are able to read and understand simple, authentic Chinese texts with the help of a dictionary and can create coherent texts on everyday topics.

Module aims	This module introduces students to the traditional Chinese script, to the language used in Chinese media and a Chinese special language. Upon completion of this module, students can read and understand short texts in classical Chinese, authentic media texts and specialised texts of medium difficulty with the help of a dictionary. Moreover, students can express themselves in longer, coherent sentences on topics addressed in the specialised or media texts in the module using an intermediate thematic vocabulary.

They obtain basic knowledge of the political system and economic policies of the People's Republic of China, societal developments in mainland China, Hong Kong and Taiwan as well as cultural developments in the Chinese-speaking world. Module aims	In this module, students acquire basic and subject-specific competence of academic research and writing. In the Basics of Scholarly Research and Writing exercise, students obtain basic skills of scholarly work, such as the research of academic topics, citing of scholarly sources and preparing of scholarly papers according to formal academic criteria. During the exercises, students learn to research the state of research on historical topics relevant for current developments and to address, present and write about debates, findings and unanswered questions. Upon completion of this module, students have a basic understanding of formal academic research and writing. They can work on the current state of research in a systemic way and to prepare for an academic discussion on a topic from Chinese Studies from the perspective of cultural studies and social sciences.

Module aims	In this module, students learn to apply research methods in Chinese Studies from social sciences and cultural studies focussing on practical academic research and writing. During the exercises, lecturers introduce students to the basics of the methods used in Chinese studies and support them in their application. Based on an overarching topic, students gain an insight into the relevance of academic methods and data collection techniques in the research process, acquire the basics of at least one method and learn to independently examine suitable material by means of selected qualitative and quantitative methods. Upon completion of this module, students can select an appropriate method for a research question and to apply it in practice following instructions.

Module aims	In this module, students are enabled to address a research question following instructions and based on literature on an advanced level and to conceptualise an academic paper. Based on the knowledge of formal criteria, contents and methods in academic research and writing as taught in modules M5 and M6, students independently prepare seminar papers in a special field of Chinese studies from the perspective of cultural studies or social sciences. This includes the formulation of a research question, a summary of the current state of research as well as the use of methods and materials required to answer the research question. In addition to sources in German and English, students are also introduced to using Chinese-language sources. Upon completion of this module, students have acquired all complementary skills to successfully complete their bachelor's thesis.

Upon completion of this module, students can independently prepare an academic paper.

Upon successful completion of the module examination Language Acquisition: Basic Level 1, the module M1-1 Language Acquisition: Basic Level 1 is deemed completed.

Module examination: Language Acquisition: Basic Level 2:

Upon successful completion of the module examination Language Acquisition: Basic Level 2, the module M1-2 Language Acquisition: Basic Level 2 is deemed completed.

Module examination: Language Acquisition: Intermediate Level 1:

Upon successful completion of the module examination Language Acquisition: Intermediate Level 1, the module M2-1 Language Acquisition: Intermediate Level 1 is deemed completed.

Module examination: Language Acquisition: Intermediate Level 2:

Upon successful completion of the module examination Language Acquisition: Intermediate Level 2, the module M2-2 Language Acquisition: Intermediate Level 2 is deemed completed.

Module examination: Language Acquisition: Consolidation Level 1:

Upon successful completion of the module examination Language Acquisition: Consolidation Level 1, the module M3-1 Language Acquisition: Consolidation Level 1 is deemed completed.

Module examination: Language Acquisition: Consolidation Level 2:

Upon successful completion of the module examination Language Acquisition: Consolidation Level 2, the module M3-2 Language Acquisition: Consolidation Level 2 is deemed completed.

§ 6 Bachelor's thesis

Students must write a bachelor's thesis as part of the course SE Bachelor's Thesis in module M8.

§ 7 Mobility during the bachelor's programme

The competent body responsible for study matters is responsible for the recognition of academic achievements completed abroad.

§ 8 Course classification

(1) The following non-continuous assessment (npi) courses are offered in the programme:

Lectures (*Vorlesung, VO*): Lectures impart basic knowledge and introduce students to an understanding of developments in China and the Chinese-speaking cultural and linguistic area based on academic methods. The assessment is based on an oral or written examination. If students take a module examination, the lectures listed in the relevant module serve to prepare students for the examination.

(2) The following continuous assessment (pi) courses are offered:

a. Course (*Kurs, KU*): Courses are complementary courses for language acquisition throughout the entire bachelor's programme. They are based on continuous assessment. Students can only attend these courses if they can provide proof of knowledge of the preceding course. The assessment is based on results of oral and written partial achievements (exams). Course registration is mandatory. The number of participants is limited.

b. Exercise (*Übung, UE*): Exercises serve to introduce students to academic research and writing. The assessment is based on the results of preparing a written paper.

Registration is mandatory for students. The number of participants is limited.

c. Seminar (SE): Seminars serve the practical application of skills required for academic research and writing acquired through the degree programme. The assessment is based on at least the results of an oral presentation and the results of the written academic paper. Course registration is mandatory. The number of participants is limited.

(3) If students take a module examination instead of completing these courses, the continuous assessment course listed in the module structure only serves the purpose of preparing for the module examination and the ECTS credits of this course are not counted towards the 180 ECTS credits of this bachelor's programme. The assessment requirement for the curriculum is to pass the module examination. These courses are marked with a preceding "p".

§ 9 Courses with a limited number of participants and registration procedure

(1) The following general limits on the number of students apply in the following courses:

- a. Course (*Kurs, KU*): 25 participants
- b. Course of the Introductory and Orientation Period (pKU): 30 participants
- c. Exercise (*Übung, UE*): 25 participants
- d. Seminar (SE): 25 participants

(2) Modalities concerning the registration for courses and examinations as well as the allocation of places in courses are governed by the stipulations of the Statutes of the University of Vienna.

§ 10 Examination regulations

(1) Assessment in courses

The lecturer of a course is responsible for making the necessary announcements according to the stipulations in the Statutes. Instead of examinations, upon the student's application, students may take module examinations if stipulated in section 5, para. 3.

(2) Examination content

The examination content relevant to preparing and holding examinations must be in line with the required number of ECTS credits. This also applies to module examinations.

(3) Examination results must be allocated to the relevant module by the stated ECTS figure and must not be allocated to different proofs of performance.

(4) No double recognition

Courses taken and examinations passed from another compulsory or elective module of the degree programme cannot be recognised within another module in the same degree programme. This also applies to recognition procedures.

(5) The bachelor's programme in Chinese Studies is deemed completed if students have passed all modules and extension curricula.

§ 11 Entry into force

This Curriculum will enter into force upon announcement in the University Gazette of the University of Vienna as of 1 October 2022.

§ 12 Transitional provisions

(1) This Curriculum applies to all students who commence their degree programme as of the winter semester of 2022/2023.

(2) If, at a later stage of the degree programme, courses are no longer offered which were compulsory under the original curricula, the competent body responsible for study matters decides ex officio (equivalence regulation) or at the request of the individual student which courses and examinations must be completed instead.

(3) Students who have started the bachelor's programme before this date may voluntarily accept the provisions of this Curriculum by simple confirmation.

(4) Students who pursue the bachelor's programme in Sinology, which entered into force prior to this Curriculum (University Gazette of 3 May 2016, 31st edition, no. 189 as amended), are entitled to complete their degree programme by 31 October 2025.

(5) The competent body responsible for study matters specified in the organisational regulations is entitled to determine in general or on a case-by-case basis which of the courses taken and examinations passed will be recognised for this Curriculum.
